WWBIC Statewide Achievements Over the Past 24 Years


- 1,100 businesses directly financed.

- 2,900 people received classroom or individualized education.


Achievements through Financial Education Programming

- 70 people have returned to school for post-secondary education.




LOAN PORTFOLIO SIZE
